Protect your dog

Leptospirosis is threat to our pets

Does your dog drink from standing water? Is your dog exposed to areas where wildlife has been? Do you take your dog to a dog park or day care?

If you've answered yes to any of these, your dog may be at risk for Leptospirosis (Lepto for short). Lepto is a potentially deadly bacterial disease that threatens the health of our canine friends. The good news is that there is a vaccine that will protect your pet. Lepto has been diagnosed in dogs living in all areas—from urban, suburban, and rural areas.

The most common Lepto carriers include raccoons, skunks, opossums, squirrels and rats. Livestock can also carry the disease.

Protection

The Lepto vaccine is safe and effective and is now available as a combination vaccine that will protect your pet from Lepto and Lyme disease (see page 2 for information on ways to protect your pet from Lyme disease). Lepto does require a booster. The RRAH team will discuss if this is an appropriate choice for your dog.

“Our job is to make people aware of the risk of their dog getting Lepto and that there is a vaccine available to protect their pet,” said Dr. Dave Brewer.

What are the symptoms?

It is important to note that some dogs don't show any signs of illness. Some dogs will show flu like symptoms that can be easily missed by owners. Once a dog begins to vomit and becomes ill, it is important that pet owners get immediate help for their pet.

Symptoms

- ◆ Lack of interest in eating
- ◆ Vomiting
- ◆ Abdominal pain
- ◆ Fever
- ◆ Yellow color in mouth or gums
- ◆ Changes in urination frequency

How are dogs exposed?

Lepto is generally spread through the urine of an infected animal. Most dogs that spend any time outdoors are at risk for Lepto. Dogs typically become infected when they come into contact with wet grass, soil, puddles, streams or ponds contaminated with the urine of the infected animals. The Lepto bacteria can enter your pet's system through a cut in the skin, or the eyes, nose, or mouth. Humans can also become infected with Lepto.

For example, an infected rat urinates in a puddle of water on the sidewalk or an infected raccoon urinates in the dew covered grass along the sidewalk. You walk your dog in these areas. Your dog steps in the contaminated area. Once home, your dog licks his feet. Your dog is exposed. That simple. That fast.
